IT COMES DOWN TO RELATIONSHIPS

In March's newsletter I shared about the significant decline observed in most churches across the US in recent years. Of course, this is of great concern. The one thing not addressed in the letter was the cause. What is driving these falling numbers? There are certainly a number of factors, but a very interesting one was raised just this last week by ABC6 in one of their reports.

They began their report by citing a recent Gallup Poll which discovered only 30% of Americans attend worship on a weekly basis now. Additionally, over the past 20 years or so there has been a large increase in the number of those who claim to have no religious affiliation whatsoever. These, some experts have labeled as, "Nones." They have no religious affiliation, in other words. This group now makes up 20% of the total US population. In contrast, over the past 20 years Jews have seen a 12% rise in affiliation and Muslims a 4% increase! But these groups make up a very small percentage of the total US population.

So, says, J.P. DeGamee, founder of the non-profit organization called Communio, "[This is] a huge, hairy problem right? It's huge if you are concerned about things far outside of faith. If you care about upward mobility, if you care about loneliness, (if) you care about longer lifespans . . . it affects all those things."

Still, what is causing this decline? The breakdown of relationships. DeGamee focuses most intensely on the collapse of marriages in the US from the 1960s onward, but there is much to be said about the collapse of interpersonal relationships in general. A host of mental health experts have observed, for instance, that Gen Z (people between the ages of 12 and 29) is often referred to as the loneliest generation. Ironically, they are also the most connected, electronically that is. Sadly, what they predominantly experience is what psychologists call pseudo-relationship, and quite frequently – they are not face-to-face but screen to screen.

Should we be surprised to learn that suicide is quickly becoming the number one cause of death for individuals between the ages of 18 and 35? Maybe God was on to something when in Genesis He said, "It is not good for man to be alone."

What then is the solution? What can we (the church) offer that will help? There are multiple solutions we need to be offering. One, we must do what we can to strengthen marriages and families. Interpersonal relationships within congregations need to likewise be strengthened simply by encouraging participation in small groups. Just this morning I was speaking to a friend who shared something he had heard about men who were committed to being a part of a small group that met regularly for Bible study and fellowship. The men were emotionally healthier. They were significantly less likely to be unfaithful to their wives and significantly more likely to be engaged in the life of their church and families.

But what about those outside our walls? That's most of our country's populations now! Most Americans don't have a church home! What can you and I do about that? It is up to us. Jesus said as much in Matthew 28 when He commissioned His followers to be His witnesses. For this reason, we are currently encouraging our members to be engaged in neighborhood prayer walks. Guidance sheets are available in the rear of the sanctuary on how to go about a prayer walk. Then in mid-April and May we will have two brief Saturday training events that we are encouraging our members and regular attenders to participate in. The first (**April 20th, 9:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.**) will help us focus on relationship-building with those who do not yet know Jesus, and challenge people to discern who God has for them to personally build a relationship with. The second (**May 18th, 9:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.**) will focus on identifying a personal life issue where Jesus has made a difference in our life. This is first step toward developing a personal Faith Story to share with those who need to encounter Jesus. Please, make plans to join us for these important trainings.

You know, I am concerned about the national decline in church attendance, of which we at Bellpoint have personally experienced. However, of greater concern to me is the spiritual loneliness that is so prevalent today among so many in our communities. Separation from God has eternal as well as present consequences. Isolation from God naturally leads to separation from other people and even eventually from oneself. In the past few weeks, on Sunday mornings we've been talking about Jesus being the One who can address the deepest spiritual longing of any soul. As you and I know Jesus Christ, we must learn how to effectively share Him with others, so that they can know Him too and enjoy a relationship with Him and His family that may begin in this world but carry on forever in the next.
