WHAT WE REALLY NEED NOW IS AUTHETIC FAITH

I recently finished a book written by William Wilberforce over 200 years ago. Thankfully, it was edited to reflect 21st Century English. William was a dear friend to both John Newton, the writer of the hymn, Amazing Grace, and the founder of our denomination, John Wesley. The book I'm referring to is titled simply, Real Christianity. Historians note that it was essential in bringing about the defeat of the British slave trade and in turn influenced the defeat of the American slave trade. I'm contemplating using it for a short-term Sunday school class sometime this next year. In the least, I highly recommend that you get a copy and read it. It's not very long and it's hard to put down very thought provoking.

As our country is heating up particularly hot during this election cycle and folks to the right and left are pinning their greatest hopes for our nation's ills on politicians and political solutions, Wilberforce's voice, though speaking from the past, encourages us to look elsewhere. It reminds me of what King

David wrote so long ago: "Some nations boast of their chariots and horses, but we boast in the name of the LORD our God." (Psalm 20:7, NLT)

The solutions to all our most pressing sociological problems are spiritual, without exception. According to Wilberforce the solutions we need actually begin with those who possess what he calls authentic or real faith, for not all who claim to posses real faith, truly have it. For your encouragement and upbuilding allow me to share with you William's Advice for Those Who Possess Authentic Faith.

For those of you who possess authentic faith in Jesus Christ, you are a very important member of contemporary culture. Even though that has been the case throughout the history of Christianity, I believe it could be said that never has our culture needed you more than it does today. I encourage you to take your role in society with a great deal of serious consideration.

The roles you play are crucial. All the research on the subject and all the anecdotal evidence point to the fact that standards of morality and religious faith are on the decline abroad, even more than here in our country. Still, the great concern I have is for the alarming rate that unbelief and evil are growing right here at home. Something must be done to combat this growing trend. If change is to come, it must start with true Christians living out their faith. It is imperative that men and women of authentic faith live out their relationship with Christ in such a way that the Church in our country again regains the respect of the culture and the allegiance of its membership. It is going to take passion to change things, and only those who truly believe are capable of having it. True believers are going to have to go the distance.

You must strive with all you have and with true sincerity to make a difference in this country. By your life and words you must put to silence the voices of ignorant critics of the faith. Be bold to proclaim the name of Christ in this time when many who call themselves Christian are ashamed to speak the name. You may have a greater impact on this nation than that of any politician if you make it your goal to help restore the influence of Christian faith and raise the standard of our nation's morality.

Get going. Be useful, generous, restrained, and self-denying in your manner of life. Treat the lack of positive action on your part as sin. If God chooses to bless you with material prosperity, don't use it on the absurd task of keeping up with the current trends and fads. By using your money modestly and without display, show that you are not a slave to fashion. Be an example of someone who uses his or her wealth for purposes that are more important than showing off or making a big impression. Demonstrate through the way you live that worldly things are not even close to the value of heavenly things. Show that you have riches that have nothing to do with material possessions and which material wealth can never acquire. Seek to form friendships with men and women of other denominations who hold to the essentials of the faith, even is they differ from you in the non-essentials. Work together with them on this great task. Pray faithfully that God might give you good success and that once again this nation might know the joy of living with a vital faith.

We live in difficult times. Pray for this nation. We have all the marks of a declining civilization. Pray that the God who hears and answers the prayers of His people might intervene on behalf of our country and bring a spiritual renewal that might save the nation. People of unbelief might think you are kidding yourself to think that prayer can make a difference. They might think you are like some superstition pagan who depends on God because you are weak. They might compare you to those who really are a bit out of touch. The fact is that God cares for the nations in which His servants live and serve Him. He favors and blesses the land of the righteous (See Proverbs 3:33).

I find it necessary to affirm that the problems we face nationally and internationally are a direct result of the decline of faith and morality in our nation. My only hope of a prosperous future for this country rest not on the size and firepower of our military, or on the wisdom of its leaders, nor on the spirit of her people, but only on the love and obedience of the people who name themselves after Christ, that their prayers might be heard and for the sake of these, God might look upon us with favor.

I pray that this might be a land where the name of Jesus Christ would still be honored and that we might be a place where the rest of the world can look and see the blessings of faithfully following Christ. I pray that if God might so ordain, our nation will be one that spreads to neighboring countries and the world at large the truth and benefits that come to any nation whose citizens confess and practice lives of authentic faith.
